Why We're Trying

The climate in the Yass Valley area is getting harsher, less predictable and more extreme.

These changes are like we are moving house from Yass to places further west, to places like Forbes, Wagga Wagga and Gilgandra - from the greener into the browner area on the map.

Our changing climate means we need to work together to adapt our places to be more resilient. We'll need more protection from heat and extreme weather for ourselves, our animals, our plants and our wildlife, and we'll need to carefully manage water in our landscape.

What We're Trying

Supporting and guiding:

- *Community conversations* – talking about what's happening to our local climate, ways we can respond and each community, group or organisation deciding where and how they want to make a difference
- *Action projects* – the first three projects are on improving soils, improving pasture management and planting ClimateWise plants around the region
- *Emerging leaders* – to grow skills in project management, facilitation, leadership and more.

About the Program

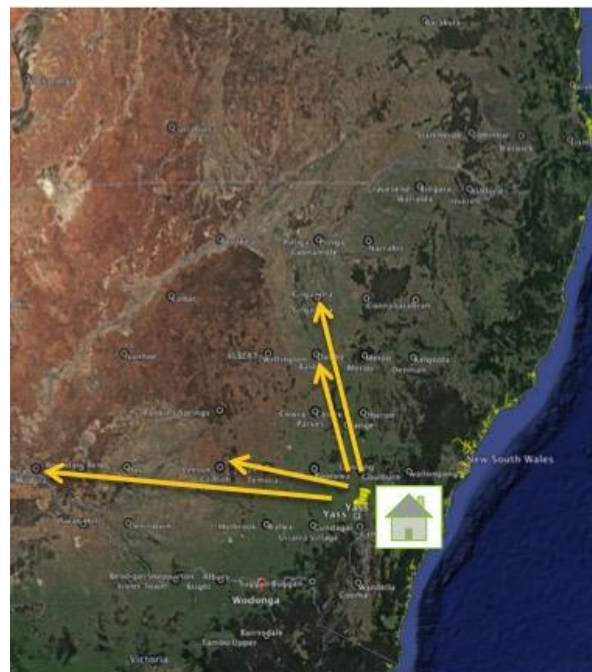
