We are now growing and selling rainforest trees, small, medium and large, some bush tucker food, and some with berries that the birds will love. And we have other native species, groundcovers and shrubs.

All our seedlings are grown from local seed, and thanks to our seed collectors, sharers and growers, we have ready-to-plant trees available. *Click here for info on 21 of our native species*

Volunteering and Work for the Dole Activities

Agreements with ETC Dorrigo and Centrelink mean we can now provide voluntary and Work for the Dole activities. Activities include composting-making, propagating and seed processing, also renovating, building,



gardening and landscaping. Record keepers, researchers and backyard propagators are also needed.

The Perfect tool for Pulling Privet



A grant from Regional Australia Bank in Armidale, via Clarence Landcare, has funded WHS gear and two **tree poppers.** These are sturdy tools, easy to use and effective on stems up to 60mm



One large and one medium Tree Popper are now in regular use at our project sites, where we are working with landholders and community groups to **remove privet** and replant with native species.

Trees Planted at Tyringham

Fifty eight trees, eleven great people, and a very satisfying two hours work. Lilly Pillies, Cypress Pines, Yellow Ash and Flame Trees were planted in a corridor. Understorey plantings are planned.







We aim to weed and reveg sections of Deep Creek in 2018. We have a plan that includes privet removal, regular maintenance, and direct planting of specific rainforest trees around and under existing privet canopy. We are seeking funding, and approvals from the relevant landholders and managers for a long term project about 1km upstream and downstream of the bridge on Tyringham Road.



Mulch anyone?

Help us transport hay from the Dairy Shed on the other side of the showgrounds to the nursery compost piles, and take home some free mulch.

_____ Seed Collecting on the Plateau

We've been to some wonderful country to collect seed this



summer. Rim of the World, on the escarpment south-west of Dorrigo, is the home of a genetically unique forest of Antarctic Beech. We gathered seed from about a dozen old trees, and brought back a few seedlings.

Adjacent to Griffith's Lookout just south-east of town, is the home of Mountain Top Landcare, a group that began planting trees in the early 90's.

They planted over 50,000 trees, fenced off 80 kilometres of creek and 160 hectares of rainforest and provided 70 cattle troughs on properties! Their vision of a network of wildlife corridors across the farming landscape connecting the two national parks has become a reality.

We collected seed of about seven different species, and plan to return in mid-February for those Rosewood and Bleeding Heart seeds that weren't quite ready. Many thanks to our seed donors! 😳
