Our groups are working on public land such as the West Goulburn Bushland, The Goulburn Wetlands, Rhiannon Rest, Budjong Creek chain of ponds and Woodwards Creek at Bungonia and across neighbouring farms, estates and institutional lands (ie. Sydney Uni)

What We Do

Activities involve practical actions like:

- Revegetation • Weed and Pest Control
- Erosion Control • Improving Water Quality.

Educational activities including training days, workshops and field days.

And citizen science including flora and fauna surveys, water testing and monitoring.

Landcare is a community-based volunteer movement that facilitates and coordinates actions to care for our land so it continues to support our community and natural resources for generations to come.

Across Australia there are more than 4000 groups working together to do something practical about protecting and restoring Australia's unique environment.

What We Want to Achieve

- Promote sustainable land and water use that increases biodiversity, ecological health and productivity
- Restore native vegetation
- Encourage a community-wide cooperative approach to caring for the land
- Create habitat, biolinks and corridors to enable the movement of flora and fauna across the landscape and to protect threatened species and vegetation communities
- Address pest species such as weeds and feral animals
- Share information on natural resource management and Landcare matters
- Help access funds to address sustainable/regenerative land practices, ecological health and biodiversity
- Partner with schools, Government Agencies, Indigenous groups and other NRM groups and organizations.
