# BUSHCARE SITE ASSESSMENT PLAN

## SITE LOCATION: GOVERNMENT RD BUSHCARE

## **AIMS**

- To enhance the genetic integrity and biodiversity of the bushland
- To reduce weed impacts throughout site
- To create a green corridor for native wildlife
- To establish a sense of place and community engagement in bushcare activities.
- To stabilise embankment

## SITE DESCRIPTION AS AT DECEMBER 2010

#### **General Description**

Location: Between Government Road and Marsala St

Aspect: Located on a steep North facing slope

<u>Soil:</u> The soil is mapped as Hawkesbury Soil Landscape. It contains Hawkesbury Sandstone rocky outcrops but also has areas of disturbance due to dumped land fill on the northern section of the reserve. The soil is classed as sandy clay loam on the upper southern slopes of the reserve. Other sections of the reserve containing miscellaneous fill. (Flora and Fauna Survey 2006-07)

**Catchment:** Pearl Bay and Middle Harbour

<u>Vegetation Community:</u> Sydney Sandstone Gully Forest (Flora and Fauna survey 06-07).

Canopy species: Angophora costata, E.botryoides, Glochodion ferdinandi var ferdinandi

Other: Open concrete channel directs runoff from Marsala St into a stormwater inlet pit in the bottom of the gully. (Flora and Fauna Survey 2006-07)

#### Site Management Issues:

- Steep land fill battered slope
- Weed infiltration from adjoining properties
- Excess nutrients from storm water runoff
- Erosion in disturbed areas
- Weeds invasion into better areas
- Low presence of midstorey species.

- Turkey rhubarb (Acetosa cordifolia)
- Crassocephalum crepidioides

Note: Work plan may change due to seasonal fluctuations and volunteer numbers. Bushcare support work may vary due to changed priority and budgetary limitations.

#### **Native Vegetation Management**

The General health of the site is expressed in the 06/07 Flora and Fauna survey as 10 – 30% weed cover throughout the entire unmade road reserve.

Zone 1 and 2 and 4 has been maintained over a long period of time by the bushcare group.

**Zone 1**: This area is located at the corner of Marsala ave and Beauty Point Road. This area has been previously maintained by volunteers but work has lapsed in this zone due to unforeseen circumstances. Extra Bushcare support will be required in this zone to control weed influxes into zone 2. This will require spray preparation hand weeding and continual spot spraying until native plants establish in the area. This zone will benefit from further plantings. A follow-up spot spray will be required once a month by the site supervisor or by contractors

**Zone 2:** This area is a steep fill battered embankment. This area can be hazardous to work on and requires further terracing of the area with logs and stakes. The area has been improved by the efforts of the Bushcare volunteers over a period of time but further work is required to shade out and reduce the weed density. Native ferns such as *Blechnum sp* and *Doodia aspera*, are particularly suitable for this shady area.

The site will require continual maintenance, planting and in some areas jute matting.

**Zone 3**: This area has been occasionally worked by the bushcare group in the past. In part of this zone there is a wall of *Cissus* antarctica and *Ipomea indica*. Extra Bushcare support is recommended to reduce annual weed influxes and to slowly push back the Cissus and Morning Glory. Further planting, terracing and jute matting will be required in this zone. A follow-up spot spray will be required once a month by the site supervisor or by contractors.

**Zone 4:** Zone 4 has areas of high resilience and should be considered a primary focus for the Bushcare group and contractors. This area may only need to be worked quarterly.

**Zone 5:** Is located at the eastern end of Unmade Government Rd. Primary weed control was undertaken in this zone in November 2010. It will require regular follow-up weed control by contractors. This area will benefit from a created edge using logs or mulch mounds and terracing using logs and stakes.

#### **Tracks and Public Access**

 There is one informal track located at the eastern end of Unmade Government Rd.

#### **Drainage / Water Management**

- An open concrete channel directs runoff from Marsala St into a stormwater inlet pit in the bottom of the gully. (Flora and Fauna Survey 2006-07)
- Debris from the fill battered slope is continually washing into the drain and requires regular cleaning. It is hoped over time the need for this will be reduced as the plantings begin to grow and cover the bare slope.

## **Major Projects / Tree Works**

 Any potential tree removals (hazardous or weed tree removal) are to be addressed with the Bushcare Officer.
