As you are aware Government funding for Landcare support staff has been drastically reduced. A 35% reduction in funding has already taken effect as of June 2018, and there is a strong possibility that most of the remaining funds will be lost in June 2019.



What does this mean for Landcare in Kyogle? Well in the interim, the Landcare Support Officer role will continue as is. We are working with our partners and the extended Landcare Network, to develop an alternative, sustainable funding stream for the future. It does however mean a decrease in the funds available to undertake community support activities such as field days, school visits, and attendance at local events and without other funds the current level of support will not be maintained.

Of course there will always be volunteers and landholders doing great work to care for the land because it's what we know is needed regardless of government policy or priorities. But we also know from experience that this community commitment is greatly enhanced and expanded by professional support from dedicated Landcare staff. The BRRVLN committee are working hard to source alternative funding streams. Ideas welcome!
