

Bracelet Honey Myrtle

Melaleuca armillaris



Family: Myrtaceae

Shrub to small tree 5 m high with white flowers





Distribution: NSW North Coast, Central Coast, South Coast, Central Tablelands Victoria and Tasmania

Description: Small wide spreading tree with fine narrow foliage and white flowers in spring/summer with hard or corky bark. Many-flowered dense spikes borne low on the branchlets. Fruit short and cylindrical. Can be pruned to a single trunk.

Propagation: Melaleucas can be propagated by either seed or cuttings. Germination should occur in 14 to 30 days, depending on the species.

Habitat: Widespread in heath communities, often on headlands or coastal ranges. It tolerates dry conditions.

Uses: Cultivated as an ornamental tree for parks and gardens. Bird attracting.
