

Seaberry Saltbush

Chenopodium candolleanum



Family: Amaranthaceae

Dense shrub to 2 m with dark red edible fruit.



Distribution: A coastal plant of Western Australia, South Australia, Victoria and New South Wales.

Description: Shiny green leaves are thick and almost succulent, with a paler underside. The flowers are small and pale, followed by small flattened dark-red sweet berries.

Propagation: Grows readily from seed

Habitat: Found on cliffs and dunes, often scrambling among other shrubs. Tolerates full sun and dry conditions.

Uses: The leaves can be cooked and eaten. The berries are also edible, sweet, with a medicinal after taste.
