Araluen Creek Restoration Project update

The Araluen Creek Restoration Project is now well underway. This project is funded by the Bushfire Community Recovery and Resilience Fund to implement sediment control strategies in the Araluen Creek.

The lengthy drought, extreme bushfires and seven major flooding events have created such high levels of damage that only major efforts can be employed to stabilise the Araluen Creek and its adjacent tributaries.

In stream works will support the creek into the future and ensure the Valley is in good condition to meet some of the undoubted challenges that climate change may well throw at us.

This project will include some work on tributaries as well as the main creek. Additionally, the upcoming workshops will help everyone gain an increased understanding of the dynamic nature of the valley and how to support re vegetation and plantings, erosion control techniques and the management of weed infestations.

Registration of Interest forms are available for landholders who would like to be involved in this important project which aims to provide support and assistance to landholders to repair and stabilize erosion points along the creek therefore, minimizing further damage.

Specifically, the focus is on sites of significant damage below the Neringla Bridge, however landholders along the tributaries of the Araluen Creek are encouraged to register to enable site identification and assessment. Could landholders who have a form and would like to participate, please return it to Cath as soon as possible to assist with planning and logistics. Thank you to those landholders who have already returned their registration, Cath will be in contact with you very soon.

Site assessments will commence Monday 16th August running through to Friday 20th.

Andy Taylor, LLS and Lyle Bogie, Soil Con will be preparing the onsite assessments and Cath Harrison will be present to provide support and assistance to landholders.
