Upper Deua Catchment Landcare Group has been funded by the Bushfire Community Recovery and Resilience Fund Project to:

Provide In-Stream Erosion Control below Neringla Bridge including tributaries and high flow channels to reduce pollution, stabilise creek banks and raise ground water levels.

This major project will be over a 12 month period and the Project Managers (UDCLG) are seeking a committed person to liaise between the landowners and the construction partners, Local Land Services and Soil Conservation (Nowra and South Coast) to assist in a timely and efficient delivery of construction services. This position has a budget of \$20 000 for intermittent work over the life of the project.

It is anticipated that the person will regularly report to the Project Managers with any issues arising with landowners or timetables for the work.

Scope of Work and Deliverables

1. The liaison responsibilities will include effective communication of the scope of the project, the value for landowners, the contribution required of landowners and overall maintain an open dialogue regarding the aims of the project and the benefits anticipated.
2. Each landowner to be supported during the assessment, prioritisation, construction and post construction phase. Each landowner to be involved with the development of a suitable contract that ensures clarity concerning inputs from all parties.
3. Each landowner to be invited to public meetings (2) to be held initially to explain the whole project and provide details of possible involvement.
4. The effective and ongoing communication between all parties is aimed at delivering the maximum number of construction sites with associated supports (vegetation, off creek watering and fencing) to ensure maximisation of the grant in terms of outcomes for the Creek and the hydration of the land.

Selection Criteria

1. Relevant experience and knowledge (summary)
2. High level of integrity and discretion.
3. Araluen community involvement and standing
4. Availability for the life of the project (12 months) July 2021/July 2022
5. Identification of any issues requiring consideration by UDCLG
