10:30	<b>Shaping Landcare: Insights from Prof. Andrew Campbell on Landcare.</b>	Andrew Campbell will reflect on the last forty years of land restoration efforts in Australia, with a particular focus on community-based programs. Lessons learned from successes and failures will inform forward-looking provocations about the direction and role of the landcare movement for the 'converging insecurities' (food, water, energy & health) of the 21st century.
11:35 or 12:15	<b>Empowering Action: Progress and Possibilities with the Landcare Enabling Program</b>	The Landcare NSW Team shares the purpose and progress of the Landcare Enabling Program, highlighting key achievements and collaborative successes to date. It outlines the next steps in building capacity across Landcare networks and issues a call to action to strengthen partnerships, skills, and community-led outcomes.

We will also investigate how to get the most out of free online spatial tools like SEED map to help with planning and telling your Landcare story more effectively.

This session will introduce the program's goals, funding opportunities, and collaborative community-based approach—highlighting how nature-based solutions like landscape rehydration and natural infrastructure can be demonstrated through local partnerships and a growing network of project sites
