# ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING - 8 AUGUST Conargo Hall - 1pm

This is a very important AGM. The future of YACTAC will be discussed and in many ways decided at this meeting. The Yanco Creek System Natural Resource Management Plan (NRMP) was formally launched in 2004 and a review has been undertaken in recent months. Bob Laing was engaged by the Board to undertake this review and he will be presenting his report at the meeting.

The four key issues of the NRMP were:

- Maintaining and improving the health of the creek and mimicking natural flooding events where possible.
- Maintaining and improving the riparian habitat (creek corridor biodiversity) along the system.
- Improving the overall deliverability and efficiency of (water) supply for the entire creek system.
- Developing community ownership, participation and empowerment to improve the future management of the system's natural resources.

Key questions need to be addressed and this meeting will give members the opportunity to contribute to the discussion. Currently there is an annual levy charged to all landowners along the Yanco Creek System to implement the NRMP. The future of this levy will be one of the key questions.

Members will be asked to consider options which include:

- Continue YACTAC in its present form, or
- Continue YACTAC with improvements/changes, or
- Continue YACTAC but change its direction, or
- Conclude that YACTAC has served its purpose and does not have a future.

Jim Parrett will be making a presentation about his findings during his recent survey of the YCS.

### **PRESIDENT - Bob Crawford**

It is essential YACTAC shout load and clear the worthiness of the Yanco Colombo System for not only the local communities but for the wider community. It is better to keep the YCS viable in the long term, for it can be achieved at far less cost than trying to revive and maintain a degraded downstream environmental site.

### **EXECUTIVE OFFICER - TANYA THOMPSON**

Once again it has been a busy few months. Engaging Bob Laing to undertake a review of the YCSNRMP has been a focus and it is hoped from this review clear pathways will be further developed both administratively and out on the system. I hope a new Natural Resource Management Plan will be developed, with achievable outcomes, which can be used to strengthen the case for the existence and viability of the YCS.

Considerable work was undertaken during the course of the year to achieve a more streamlined end of financial year program. This has been achieved with cost savings in accounting fees. The organisation will be moving to utilize Xero Accounting in the 2018/19 financial year. With this move it is with regret that Hayley Wordsworth will no longer be involved and I would like to take this opportunity to thank Hayley for her professionalism and efforts over many years. It was greatly appreciated and I will certainly miss her input.

### **NSW IRRIGATORS COUNCIL**

A meeting was held this month in Sydney.

There appears strong support for the newly created Natural Resources Access Regulator - NRAR (metering and compliance regulator). These duties have been moved from Dol Water and WaterNSW. The principal objectives of the NRAR are:

- to ensure effective, efficient, transparent and accountable compliance and enforcement measures for the natural resources management legislation.
- to maintain public confidence in the enforcement of the natural resources management legislation.

YACTAC and others, in the Southern Basin, have argued against private ownership of meters. Formal public consultation in August/September on the changes to metering/water take measurement regulations will be hosted by Dol Water.

New Meter Standards:

- Patent Approved and meet Australian Standard 4747.
- Independently verified for accuracy (+/-5%).
- Tamper evident seals, data loggers.
- Telemetry objective for all users above the threshold to be telemetered.
- Existing meters below the threshold to be replaced with an accurate meter.

5 year implementation plan:

- 500mm pump or larger by Dec 2019.
- Southern regions by Dec 2021.

#### Sustainable Diversion Limit adjustment mechanism - SDL

- 23 projects in NSW (3 in the Yanco System).
- Preliminary Business Cases online.
- Projects required to be delivered by 2024.

YACTAC has consistently presented the view of continuous flow in the YCS at all stakeholder meetings. This view is also held by other stakeholders in the valley, in fact the Murrumbidgee Field Naturalists are sending a letter to Minister Blair in support of continuous flow and against the Yanco Regulator, however there is some opposition to continuous flow.

### **CULTURAL WATER**

Up until recently there has been very little discussion and information around cultural water. However, Rene Woods from Murray Lower Darling Rivers Indigenous Nations (MLDRIN) presented at the recent EWAG and NSWIC meetings. MLDRIN is a confederation of sovereign First Nations from the southern part of the Murray Darling Basin. MLDRIN is focused on caring for our rivers and achieving water rights for Aboriginal people. The group includes delegations from 25 First Nations.

#### Advisory Panel - SAP

There have been a number of staff changes again, as with all government departments dealing with water.

At a recent meeting where 4 people were presenting all 4 had been engaged within the last 12 months.

This constant change in staff, in my view, compounds and delays efficiency.

The Commonwealth Minister for Agriculture and Water Resources, the Hon. David Littleproud MP, announced the bi-partisan agreement which covers key themes:

1. Strengthening protection of environmental flows.

2. Strengthening Compliance with Basin Water Laws.

3. Improving outcomes for indigenous people and addressing the social and economic impacts of the Murray Darling Basin.

4. Improving confidence in the Northern Basin Review data.

5. Improving the Sustainable Diversion Limit Adjustment Mechanism.

#### NSW Water Management Agencies

### **BILLABONG YANCO PROJECT**

The Billabong Yanco Steering Committee began in June 2013, strategic planning commenced and implementation of works started in February 2014. The committee was initially funded by the NSW and Federal Governments - Caring for our Country Program and then the National Landcare Program took over that role. Over \$400,000 was spent in the Billabong region.

Ambitious goals were set and then revised to the following:

- Integrate management of water flows in the Billabong Yanco system.
- Improving land manager ability to effectively manage key weeds.
- Promoting best practice pest animal control methods.
- Providing options for improved grazing management and adapting to a changing climate.

Committee members had the opportunity to decided where funds would be expended and control over projects. This was a brilliant and effective program which unfortunately will not be replicated.

The networking between the stakeholders was fundamental in creating a working environment which had the one goal of improving the outcomes of environment and the local community.

All stakeholders and especially the team leaders Trish Bowen and Els Tack, NSW Murray Local Land Services, are to be congratulated for their efforts and those of their team, in driving this initiative.

#### INVESTIGATING TROUT COD SPAWNING & RECRUITMENT IN THE YANCO - COLOMBO CREEKS

The major recommendation from this study is to restore a flow regime to Yanco -Colombo Creeks that supports trout cod ecology, by mitigating extreme discharge and water level variability that has persistently occurred.

The key elements of the hydrograph for trout cod in Yanco-Colombo Creek have been noted and will be made publically available when the report is officially released.

A second recommendation is for fish community surveys to be undertaken during December-January 2018/19 to confirm the occurrence or continued absence of trout cod in the Yanco-Colombo Creek system.
