Cultural heritage

Promote and protect a shared, whole-of-community history and future, celebrating both Indigenous and non-Indigenous values. Our natural landscape features significant values and importance through continuous cultural, spiritual, and heritage connections as well as traditional practices across highly productive waterways, numerous wetlands and floodplains.

Education

Create a lifelong living lab, for local and visiting students from schools and universities to do research that contributes to the understanding and management of the creek system. Sharing knowledge through engaging workshops and training opportunities will improve understanding and unity.

Recreation

Preserving public access to Crown Land is important to community and to provide opportunities for recreational activities such as camping, birdwatching, fishing, boating, walking and other activities.

Well-being

Maintaining places for quietness, openness, aesthetics, and connecting with nature are important elements in supporting community health and well-being.

Opportunities

Create partnerships, youth employment (return to area), and projects for diverse groups to work together.

Identified activities

- Enhance community knowledge and understanding by delivering tailored education and training
- Develop Cultural Heritage Management Plan to promote and protect all heritage
- Collate all existing data to a single source to define extent of heritage estate
- Link Aboriginal cultural locations and practices to environmental watering plans
- Identify community priority sites/locations
- Develop priority location activity implementation plans
- Identify knowledge gaps and develop targeted research programs
- Further develop and create new partnerships with relevant stakeholder groups and organisations
- Secure additional funding resources
