Landholder Registration of Interest

This project is funded through the Commonwealth/State Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangement and we have partnered with South East Local Land Services and Upper Shoalhaven Landcare Council. The primary aim is to support the recovery of the Araluen Creek and its tributaries down to the confluence with the Deua river, following extensive drought and flooding. *Projects will be developed with landholders to focus on promoting the preservation of soils and the regeneration of native vegetation.*



Project activities may include soil conservation earthworks, streambed and bank works, fencing of vulnerable areas and alternate stock water. Works generally require regeneration the existing native vegetation and this may involve fencing, re-vegetation and weed control.

South East LLS and Soil Conservation Service will undertake all erosion control works as part of this project.

Funding for each remedial site will include weed control, re-vegetation plants, structural materials, waterway fencing and alternate stock water arrangements. UDCLG and each landowner will review the recommended site works and determine a way forward.

Eligibility for incentive projects will be considered based on: (i) the landholder's ability to meet any matching criteria for funding provided, (ii) the landholders ability to complete necessary works within an agreed time frame (iii) the landholders willingness to maintain and monitor project sites (iv) how the project rates from an environmental perspective (v) project locations within or adjacent the Araluen Creek and its tributaries.
