Araluen Creek Restoration Project

It is anticipated that by mid-February Soil Conservation construction works at the 13 sites will be completed. Planning is well underway to facilitate the commencement of the revegetation program.

The remediation of the 13 sites will deliver stability, reduce sediment movement, control erosion and future bank collapses.

Upcoming Weed Workshop



At this workshop weed management experts, Apical, will outline restoration, remediation and weed eradication processes and principles.

They will also provide practical demonstrations of weed removal and bush regeneration on site along Araluen Creek.

The focus will be on — creepers and native grasses, in particular, Madeira Winter Cherry Vine, an emerging threat in the region and weed grasses such as Serrated Tussock and African Lovegrass.

Techniques will address management and control measures for different stages of growth – seedling through to mature plants.

What is Feral Fighters?

Feral Fighters is a community-based initiative led by local champions, coordinating land managers to improve pest animal management and the protection of natural, economic and social assets.

These group programs see neighbours and the wider community conduct control activities across a large area, to reduce the impacts of pests, such as foxes, feral pigs and rabbits.

How do I become a Feral Fighter?

For new Feral Fighter participants please contact your local South East Local Land Services office where our staff will provide all the information on how to join an existing or establish a new Feral Fighters program in your area.

What are the benefits of being a Feral Fighter?

Each Feral Fighters group has a local group coordinator. After joining the program, our staff will be on hand to help connect you to your nearest group and help you and your neighbours take part in a group control program.

If you are unsure of who your local coordinator is, or are a new landholder wishing to participate, contact your local South East Local Land Services office.

Feral Fighters also receive support and resources from Local Land Services, including:

- free vertebrate pesticide induction training (VPIT)
- free baits and bait products
- up-to-date advice from a local Biosecurity Officer.

What training do I need?

To take part in any of our coordinated baiting programs, you must hold a valid Vertebrate Pesticide Induction Training (VPIT) certification or an AQF3 Chemical Accreditation. Training in the use of vertebrate pesticides helps to ensure you remain compliant with legislation and use pesticides safely and effectively.

Our online VPIT course can be completed at any time, at no cost and upon successful completion, you will hold a five year accreditation to possess and use 1080, Pindone, RHDV and or PAPP baits.
