

NSW Landcare Enabling Program

Mid-point Coordinator Activity Tracker report



Local Land Services (LLS) and Landcare NSW are working together to deliver the Landcare Enabling Program (LEP), empowering local communities, Landcare groups and networks to improve sustainable agriculture and management of natural resources.

The Program supports Landcare groups across NSW, funding coordinators and support staff who play a vital role in driving on-ground action and strengthening community capacity.

Coordinator Activity Tracker overview

The Landcare Enabling Team collects data from the Landcare community via a Coordinator Activity Tracker.

The tracker helps to demonstrate the impact of government investment in the NSW LEP. This mid-program report does not represent a complete dataset, but provides insights into the scope and range of activities performed by NSW LEP roles.

All LEP-funded roles must complete at least 10 entries per FTE per month, resulting in

18,000

entries completed across 144 staff (82.5 FTE roles).

Key statistics

The following statistics highlight the breadth and impact of activities delivered across NSW during the first phase of the program.

*Data from February 2024 – June 2025



270 monitoring activities were organised, involving **3,200** volunteer hours.



6,000 communications products were developed, resulting in around **5 million** public interactions.



194 funding sources were accessed beyond Landcare.



\$3.9 million in grant funding was secured.



370 field days were organised and an additional **180** field days supported.



More than **1,800** partners worked alongside Landcare.



370 training and/or education activities were organised, with an additional **80** activities supported.



Staff participated in **672** on-ground activities such as planting, maintenance, and pest control.
